

Nadine Stott Day

Nadine Stott Day, 87, of Ogden, Utah, and Eagle, Idaho, died Wednesday, November 2, 2005 at St Luke's Meridian Medical Center in Meridian, Idaho. She was a resident of Spring Creek Manor in Eagle, ID.

Nadine, the first child of Joseph Leo Stott and Velma Bushnell, was born on May 4, 1918, in Meadow, Utah. Being the daughter of a farmer, she spent her childhood helping with farm



chores including milking cows before and after her schoolwork. She attended school in Millard County, Utah and later attended BYU in Provo, Utah. In the summer of 1939 she worked as an intern in Washington, D.C. before returning home to Meadow where she married her high school sweetheart, Glade Riley "Tom" Day, on July 18, 1939 in Junction, Utah. After Tom graduated from pharmacy school in 1940, they lived for a short time in Brigham City, Utah, before moving to Clearfield, Utah, where they worked side by side in the Clearfield Pharmacy until 1955. A move to Ogden, Utah, allowed Nadine to have time to spend with her family and friends as Tom continued to work in Vince's pharmacies in Ogden. Nadine worked for Hill Air Force Base and later for the IRS as a tax examiner. She was a member of the L.D.S. church and active in various social groups and clubs in Ogden, including the Elks and Mt Ogden Golf Association. Nadine was a charter member of the Chareya Service Club of Ogden. Nadine loved to spend time with her friends on the golf course and playing bridge or Mahjong. She always had something in her hands on which she was working. Nadine loved to wear her hand-knit outfits and display her needlepoint projects. She later took up china painting and produced many unique and beautiful pieces, which she shared with her friends and family.

Nadine is survived by her husband Glade "Tom"; 5 children, Sondra Lisle (Clay) of Eagle, ID; Sunny Hemphill (Bill) of Florence, MT; Tom L. Day (Kay) of Ogden, UT; Richard Day (Betty) of Four Corners, WY; Des Hughes (Kevin) of Eagle, ID; 16 grandchildren; 36 great-grand children; 1 brother, Joseph Stott of Meadow, UT, and 4 sisters, Leola George of Orem UT, Stella Johnson of Holden, UT, Donna Mae Warner of West Valley, UT, and Reah Rowley of Boise, ID.

Nadine was preceded in death by her parents, her brother, Ben, of Meadow, UT and two grandchildren, Jason Riley Day and Neil Holmes.
