

Glade Riley (Tom) Day



Glade Riley (Tom) Day, 88, of Ogden, Utah, and Florence, Montana, died Wednesday, August 23, 2006 in Florence, where he lived and was cared for by his daughter Sunny. Tom, the

third child of Richard Erven Day and Stella Huntsman, was born on June 29, 1918, in Fillmore, Utah. He graduated from Millard High School in Fillmore and attended Utah State University before transferring to Idaho State University in Pocatello, Idaho. During his senior year at ISU he married his high school sweetheart, Nadine Stott, on July 18, 1939 in Junction, Utah. Together they successfully raised five healthy and grateful children. Nadine died in Nov. 2005.

After graduating from pharmacy school in 1940, Tom and Nadine lived for a short time in Brigham City, Utah, before moving to Clearfield, Utah, where they worked side by side in the Clearfield Pharmacy with Tom's best friend, Les Otte. A move to Ogden, Utah in 1955 allowed Tom and Nadine time to spend with family and friends as Tom continued to work at Vince Tassone's pharmacies in Ogden, and later at Sherwood Drug with Fred Ulrich. Tom acquired various rental units in Ogden but he loved working in his "garden on the mountain" where he grew a variety of vegetables in mostly granite rock soil. Later, he and his faithful sidekick "Chunga" worked a large garden in South Ogden. Tom was known to have a quick wit and keen sense of humor. One of his favorite lines was "Forget what?" Abercrombie Dad, we will miss you and the

jokes, and don't forget to tell Curly (Mom) "Hi" from all of us.

Tom is survived by 5 children, Sondra Lisle (Clay) of Eagle, ID; Sunny Hemphill (Bill) of Florence, MT; Tom L. Day (Kay) of Ogden, UT; Richard Day (Betty) of Four Corners, WY; Des Hughes (Kevin) of Eagle, ID; 16 grandchildren; 16 great-grand children; 1 brother, Vance Day of Billings, MT. and 2 sisters, Belva Day of Fillmore, UT and Daila Paxton of Salt Lake City, UT.

Tom was preceded in death by his parents, his wife, Nadine and two grandchildren, Jason Riley Day and Neil Bennett Holmes. It was Tom's choice to be cremated. A living memorial and family reunion was held July 2006 in Florence. Four generations were able to visit and celebrate being part of the family. Dad was in great spirit and visited with all.
